Quarterly Focus Parking Lot Upgrades

Over the years our Parking Lot has had a few improvements made to it. Back in 2002 the front section of the lot was coated with a rough coat of blacktop which lasted for about 9 years. In 2011 we had that section coated with Tar and Chip. The back part of the lot has never been given much attention. So we decided that this year the Parking Lot is in need of some much needed upgrades. The lot is uneven, there are no designated parking spots, or signage present, and it has become a safety and aesthetics issue.

In January taking advantage of some decent weather Vollmer Tar and Chip began some prep work to the parking lot. The bad spots were dug out, and the back area has been slightly enlarged and squared off to make it look better. Later this Spring Vollmer Tar and Chip will return to do more prep and clean-up work before putting a complete coat of Tar and Chip on the entire lot for the finished surface. This will take place in May or June. We will then plot parking spaces, add some nice directional signs, and some stop bumpers, and guide poles which should make the Shop look much nicer. We also plan to fix the Flag Pole and paint the doors and awnings and maybe the Shed if time permits. Below are some pictures from the Construction prep work in January.
